## **Report Course Evaluation**

Please find attached the feedback the students gave on your course. To facilitate the interpretation of the results, we have compiled some information for you:

Your report contains an indicator, so you can easily compare your course to others from your department and also use it as a basis for the discussion with your students. The indicator *LLI (Lehr-Lern-Index)* is calculated from the arithmeticÁ mean of the questions 2-7 in the area "Teaching & Learning" in the questionnaire.
